





How to Reach Bahra University?

Bahra University is surrounded with lush green flora and fauna in the hills of District Solan, Himachal Pradesh. Bahra University is situated on Chandigarh- Shimla Highway (NH-22), just 90 kms from Chandigarh (north) and 23 kms from Shimla (Capital of Himachal Pradesh). It can be reached by trains connecting Kalka to Shimla. Nearest railway station is Kaithlight, 5 kms away from Bahra University on Kalka- Shimla Heritage rail route. Second nearest station is Shimla 23 kms away from Bahra University. It can also be reached by air routes where Chandigarh and Shimla happen to be the nearest airports. Shimla Airport is 23 kms far from Bahra University. The moot hosts will arrange for a pick-up facility at Wagnaghat from the road point, if transporting by road, and from Kaithlight Railway Station, if travelling by Rail service only if informed in advance.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 1: DATES AND VENUE

1. The 5th edition Moot Court Competition 2026 is scheduled for 16th April – 18th April, 2026.
2. The venue for the event is Bahra University, Solan (Waknaghat), Tehsil, Kandaghat, Distt. Solan, Himachal Pradesh, PIN – 173234.

ARTICLE 2: AWARDS

Runners Up Team	Rs. 10000
Best Speaker	Rs. 5000

Best Memorial	Rs. 5000

ARTICLE 3: TEAM REQUISITES:

- Each team shall comprise of minimum of 2 members and maximum of 3 members. In a team comprising of 2 members, Both the members shall be designated as speakers and one shall appear for researcher's test. In a team comprising of 3 members, the 3rd member of the team shall be designated as researcher.
- Arguments shall generally be in English only.
The competition is open for Bonafide students pursuing five year and three years LL.B course.
- Teams should not disclose the identity of their institution during the course of proceedings in the Court Rooms.
- Any disclosure of team identities shall invite penalties including Disqualification.
- Each team shall be provided with the unique team code for the competition.

ARTICLE 4: REGISTRATION:

- Registration form complete with all Team Details must be submitted online by **10th April, 2026** on mootcourtsociety@bahrauniversity.edu.in
- The registration fee is **Rs. 4000 (Without Accommodation) Or Rs. 5000 (With Accommodation)**

- No change in the names of the participants shall be permitted after the receipt of the Registration Form.
- Teams should clearly mention the names of all participants in the team, including course, year/semester of study and contact number.

No team would be facilitated with the certificates during the competition. The same shall be provided only in the Valedictory Ceremony. No certificates will be sent through courier.

Online Registration:

The registration shall be deemed complete only after the successful submission of the registration fees along with a duly filled final registration form latest by 23:59:59 Hrs IST on April 10, 2026. The team shall nominate one team member to be the 'contact person'. This person will be responsible for all the official communication between the Organizing Committee and the team.

Registration Fees once paid shall be non-refundable. On successful registration, participants will receive an acknowledgment email.

A scanned copy of the registration form, duly signed by the Head of Department of the college/institution/university, along with the fees receipt of the payment for the moot court competition, has to be attached during the online registration process. Registrations without the aforementioned requisites shall not be considered valid.

The payment has to be made online (NEFT, RTGS, IMPS, etc.) in the account mentioned below:

Payment of Rs. 4000/- (Indian Rupees Four Thousand only) OR Rs. 5000/- (Indian Rupees Five Thousand only)

The receipt/screenshot of the online transfer has to be uploaded along with the registration form itself. ARTICLE 5: DRESS CODE

Inside the court room the participants shall follow the below mentioned dress code:

- Females: White Kurta, Black Salwar and Black Dupatta or White Shirt and Black Trousers along with the Black Coat and Tie.
- Males: White Shirt, Black Trousers, Black Tie along with Black Coat and Black Shoes.

ARTICLE 6: ACOMMODATION

All the teams who require the Accommodation facilities shall inform the moot court committee before **10th April, 2026**. The participants would be provided Accommodation for the period of the Competition in the premises of the Institute.

Please note that separate accommodation will be provided for girls and boys. However, they may sit together for team work in the library/café of the institute. You are advised to check the weather conditions of Shimla before leaving from your native places. The University would start providing accommodations to participants on **16th April 2026** after **2:00 PM** and participants would have to vacate the accommodation provided by the University by **5:00 PM** on **18th April 2026**.

ARTICLE 7: COMPETITION ROUNDS

All the rounds shall be on Knock Out basis EXCEPT Preliminary Rounds. These shall spread over a period of 3 days -

- a. Preliminary (Both side)*
- b. Quarter Finals (08 Teams)*
- c. Semi-Finals (4 Teams)*
- d. Grand Finale (2 Teams)*

ARTICLE 8: RULES FOR ALL THE ROUNDS

1. The criteria of marking shall be the court wins in each court room in Preliminary Rounds. In case of tie, cumulative marks of the teams will be taken into consideration including even the Memorial marks.
2. **MARKING CRITERIA FOR THE ARGUMENTS:** Each Speaker shall be marked on a total of 100 marks by each Bench Judge. The following will be the Marking Criteria and the Marks allocated to each speaker by each Judge in all Rounds:
 - Appreciation and Application of Facts. (30) Marks
 - Identification and Articulation of Issues. (10) Marks

- Application of legal principles. (20) Marks
- Use of authorities and precedents. (20) Marks
- Response to questions and Presentation (20) Marks

3. MARKING CRITERIA FOR THE MEMORIAL

- Knowledge of law and extent of research- 20 marks
- Proper and articulate analysis, clarity and organization- 20 marks
- Knowledge of facts- 20 marks
- Evidence of original thought and grammar- 20 marks
- Correct format and citation- 20 marks

Total 100 marks and marks allotted by judges shall be final.

ARTICLE 9: TIME SCHEME FOR ORAL ROUNDS

1. PRELIMINARY ROUND AND QUARTER FINALS

- Each team shall be given a total of **30 minutes** (maximum) to present their case inclusive of Rebuttals
- Each speaker should speak for a minimum **10 minutes**.
- One speaker shall not take more than **15 minutes** of the total time.
- The maximum time for Rebuttals and Sur-Rebuttals is **5 minutes**.

2. SEMI FINAL ROUNDS AND FINAL ROUND

- Each team will get a total of **40 minutes** to present their case inclusive of Rebuttals.
- Each speaker should speak for a minimum of **15 minutes**.
- One speaker shall not take more than **25 minutes** of the total time.
- The maximum time for Rebuttals and Sur-Rebuttals is **10 minutes**.

3. MAXIMUM ALOTTED TIME

The maximum time provided would include the time that each team may wish to reserve for their rebuttal/sur-rebuttal. At the commencement of each session, the team shall notify the Court Officer/Court Clerk regarding the division of time between the 2 speakers (including rebuttal/sur- rebuttal).

ARTICLE 10: MEMORIALS

- All teams must submit the soft copy of their Memorials for both sides. Also, the teams shall bring along **FIVE (5) Hard copy** of their typed Memorials for both sides which shall be submitted at the time of Formal Registration.

- The Memorials must fulfill all the following specifications;
 - Cover page / Cause title
 - Index
 - Index of Authorities
 - Statement of Jurisdiction
 - Synopsis of Facts
 - Statement of Issues
 - Summary of Arguments / Pleadings
 - Body of Arguments / Pleadings
 - Conclusion / Prayer

- The memorials shall not be in more than thirty (30) pages and the Arguments Advanced shall not exceed more than fifteen (15) pages.
- The Memorials shall be typed on A4 size page in Font type: Times New Roman, Font size: 12, 1.5 line spacing & 1-inch margin on each side. OSCOLA pattern of citation shall be followed.
- The Cover Page of the Memorials must follow the following color scheme, **Blue for the Petitioner Cover Page** and **Red for the Respondent Cover Page**.
- The Memorials must be spiral bound **ONLY**. Each team would be provided with a MEMORIAL CODE at the time of online registration which will be mentioned on the top right-hand side of the cover page of each memorial in **BOLD LETTERS**.
- The memorials exchange will be for Preliminary Rounds, Quarter Finals, Semi-Finals & Finals.
- The Memorials must not contain any Annexures/Photographs/Sketches/Exhibits/Affidavits etc.
- Memorials that do not comply with the above-mentioned specifications will be penalized.
- Identification of any type on the memorials shall invite disqualification.

ARTICLE 11: CRITERIA FOR THE SUBMISSION OF MEMORIALS

- One soft copy of memorials of each side (in PDF format) and scanned copy of Travel Form, must reach the organizers latest by **12th April, 2026** on mootcourtsociety@bahrauniversity.edu.in
- The subject of the email should be “***Submission of Memorials for BU-__***”. The file names of the electronic copies of the Memorials must contain only the team code and the side being represented (P for Petitioner & R for Respondent).

Eg. Petitioner Memorial of BU-501 should be named “BU501_P”.

ARTICLE 12: ORAL SUBMISSIONS

- Each team shall comprise of two (2) speakers, as has been specified earlier.
- Court language shall be English.
- Each team will have a maximum of thirty (30) minutes to present their Oral Submissions in Preliminary Rounds. No speaker will be permitted to address the Court for more than fifteen (15) minutes. This includes the time the speaker addresses the Court during the rebuttal/sur-rebuttal. The maximum time for rebuttal/sur-rebuttal is five (5) minutes.
- The maximum time allotted in semi-finals and final shall be forty (40) minutes for each team. No speaker shall be allowed to address the Court for more than twenty-five (25) minutes. This includes the time the speaker addresses the court during rebuttal/sur-rebuttal. The maximum time for rebuttal/sur-rebuttal is ten (10) minutes.
- At the commencement of each session of Oral Submissions, each team must notify the Court Officer of the amount of time that the team reserves for their rebuttal/sur-rebuttal.
- At the commencement of each session of Oral Submissions, each team shall notify the Court Officer as to the division of time between the 2 speakers.
- If any speaker continues to speak after the completion of his/her time, he/she shall entail penalty, which shall be upon the discretion of the judges.
- The final decision as to the time structure and the right to rebuttal/sur-rebuttal will be that of the Bench Judges.
- During the course of oral submissions, the participants cannot submit to then court any material containing pictorial representation whatsoever. Further the participants will not be permitted to make any audio/visual representation nor will they be allowed to use personal computers, laptops and any other technical or mechanical device during their oral submissions.
- Speakers shall not be allowed to pass annexures to the judges; instead, the teams may make a compendium of annexure that shall be given to the judges before the start of the proceedings.
- If at any instance, a submission is made with any material in violation to the above clause and if any picture, sketches, photos, cartoons, caricatures, audio film, video film, projector-slide or a computer-generated image is submitted or presented to the court, the teams shall be disqualified from the competition forthwith.
- During the course of the Oral Submissions speaker shall neither reveal his/her identity nor the identity of their University / College by any means whatsoever.

ARTICLE 13: SCOUTING



MOOT PROPOSITION

1. Indicland is a democratic country with rich heritage and culture. Indicland has the world's largest written Constitution, which incorporates various principles such as equality, liberty and fraternity amongst individuals and the government. The principles of liberty and equality have been conferred on individuals through the provisions of the fundamental rights available in Chapter III of the Constitution of Indicland. In 2021, the Legislature of Indicland announced the enactment of three new criminal laws. The new laws overhaul criminal justice system. They aim to revamp and replace the old laws, by considering implementation of justice through a victim centric approach, increasing focus on social security and introducing digital/electronic evidence reviews. These Acts came into force on 1st March, 2022. After enforcement of new Criminal Laws, the substantive penal law to be covered under the Indicland Nyaya Sanhita 2022, (INS), evidence regulation to be covered under the Indicland Sakshya Adhinyam 2022, (ISA) and criminal procedure to be covered by the Indicland Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2022, (INSS).

2. Mr. Satish, a resident of Premnagar district in Himpradesh State, was a peon in a private school. It was challenging for him to meet the expenses of the household and the needs of his three children and wife with his salary. His elder daughter Meena, age 20 years, was in the final year of her graduation. As she was a bright student, it was easy for her to take admission in the Government College. Since the age of 16, she was financially independent as she used to give private tuitions to the school students. To support her father financially, she decided to join a coaching institute as a part-time Teacher of Mathematics.

3. Mr. Prateek, age 28 years, was the owner of the private coaching institute and a teacher of science in the same institute. Meena got a job in the institute by the reference of her senior. She was comfortable with the working conditions of the institute and now she could save money to deposit the school fees of her younger siblings. She was impressed by the behaviour and teaching style of Mr. Prateek. She always admired him and also told her colleagues various times that her boss is an inspiration. On the occasion of Meena's birthday, a party was organized by the owner of the institute who also gifted her an expensive smart mobile phone. As Meena was aware of the increase in the number of admissions in class of Mathematics, it was easy for her to accept the expensive gift believing it to be a reward for her hard work. On 4th May, 2022, after classes, Mr. Prateek invited Meena to a cafe near the institute for a cup of coffee. During the conversation, he proposed her for marriage.

Meena was shocked as it was unexpected for her due to their different economic status but she told Prateek that the proposal was like a compliment for her. She left the cafe and told everything to her parents after reaching home. The next day, Meena discontinued her coaching job and communicated the refusal of marriage to Mr. Prateek through a telephone call.

4. On 15th May, 2022, Prateek along with his friend Naveen approached her parents with the marriage proposal for their daughter. Father of Meena firmly denied the proposal due to caste differences as marriage of his younger daughter would be tough task for him if he would allow inter-caste marriage of elder daughter. They were even not ready for the marriage of Meena as she was their financial support. Prateek tried to extend assurance for the higher studies of the younger brother and sister of Meena by financial support but Meena's father aggressively asked him to leave their house as it was like an offer of bribe for him. He warned him to stay away from his daughter and communicated that she has discontinued the job. Meena and her younger brother Veda (Age 18 years) were silently witnessing the whole instance. After this instance, on 20th May, 2022, Veda met Prateek in his institute as he was impressed with financial status of Prateek and according to him the lifestyle and status of his whole family would be upgraded if he got married to his sister Meena. He motivated Prateek and suggested him not to give up as Meena was denying to get married to Prateek only because of his father and his father was rejecting the offer under societal pressure.

5. Meena was in urgent need of job as her father was unable to repay the loan which he had taken for the treatment of his wife and he was receiving threatening calls from the creditors. There were clear warnings from the creditors that his whole family will have to suffer on failure of repayment of loan. Meena was also worried about educational expenses of her younger siblings. After three months, Meena joined another coaching institute in the same locality named Grand Tower where the institute of Prateek was running. The new institute offered a higher salary with a full-time job as Meena had completed her graduation. The job was in two shifts, first from 10:00 AM to 1:30 PM and second from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM.

Many times, Prateek tried to meet her and communicate with her but Meena started avoiding Prateek. On one occasion, Meena also made it clear to him that she really admired him but she would not go against the wishes of her parents and he was wasting his time by following her. Despite the disinterest shown by Meena, Prateek continued to follow her and contacted her through telephone and social media platforms with the hope of a positive response.

6. On 7th September, 2022, at the occasion of the marriage of the cousin sister of Meena, Prateek met father and uncle of Meena and tried to convince them about his feelings for Meena and how he could change Meena's life. But again, the proposal of Prateek was rejected by her father and uncle. He was admonished in front of whole gathering for his disturbing actions. Prateek felt insulted and warned Mr. Satish for his behavior. It is undisputed that neither Meena nor her family lodged any formal complaint alleging harassment or stalking by Prateek. Prateek was furious due to the behavior of Meena's family. In the evening, he visited Naveen who is 40 years of age, Senior Lab Technician in Modern Health Care Laboratory and best friend of Prateek. According to Prosecution Witness no. 5, Mr. Dinesh, (Age 32 years, colleague of Naveen) he visited Naveen to deliver some products of laboratory to Naveen; he stayed for a cup of coffee as Naveen insisted for it. At that time Mr. Prateek came to Naveen and he witnessed the meeting of Prateek and Naveen as Mr. Prateek narrated the whole feelings of insult and disappointment to his friend Naveen. Naveen asked him to relax and assured him that he would suggest a way out to attain his wish. On 8 September 2022, Prosecution Witness No. 3, Mr. Pratap (tea stall owner near Naveen's residence), overheard fragments of a conversation between the two friends regarding meeting "the girl" at a place away from family surveillance. He stated that Naveen suggested that if persuasion failed, they could "convince her organically or inorganically."

7. On 27th September, 2022, at 5:15 PM, Mr. Satish got a call from a stranger and he was called to Government Hospital as soon as possible. After reaching the hospital, police told him that his daughter Meena was attacked with acid and was taken to the government hospital by strangers who reached on the spot after hearing the screams of the victim. The doctor immediately conducted the surgeries and opined that the injuries were grievous and she was facing difficulties in breathing as her windpipe was harmed. She was unconscious after the surgery due to the high dose of medicines. When she gained her conscience, she was not able to speak properly.

The next day on 28th September, 2022, any how she told her younger sister Jeeva, age 11 years, Prosecution Witness No. 1, with broken speech and gestures as to how this whole instance of acid attack happened. She was mostly muttering words as she was not in condition to speak clearly. She told her that on the day of incident, in afternoon, Prateek along with his friend Naveen came to her in the park and tried to convince her to marry Prateek. He asked her to accompany him to the temple so that they could get married and ensured their safety by the political and financial powers of Prateek. When Meena refused for the same, Naveen who was

carrying the bottle of acid, threatened Meena that they would harm her family if she does not follow them. Prateek started dragging her on the way to his car. Meena started shouting and abusing. Meanwhile, Naveen tried to shut her mouth by grabbing her mouth from behind to avoid public attention but Meena took out a small knife from her bag which her father gave her for self-defense and managed to cut wrist of Naveen, he left her as meanwhile he was screaming in pain. Meena turned towards Prateek with the same knife that was dripping blood, Prateek stepped back. After this she could only remember Naveen stepping towards her with some kind of container in his hand, thereafter she could only recall the burning sensations and severe pain. After narrating this instance, she started crying and went into state of unconsciousness.

8. Jeeva went to her father who was sitting outside the emergency room and narrated Meena's condition to him, his father consulted the matter with doctor. The doctor analyzed her condition and according to the doctor she was under mental trauma. The attending doctor recorded in the medical file that the patient was "under heavy sedation and not fully oriented to time and place" at the time of interaction with relatives. No Magistrate was called to record a formal dying declaration, although the hospital is located near the District Court complex. She died on 30th September, 2022, and the postmortem report cited the injuries of the windpipe due to acid burns and other major injuries on internal nerves by acid as a reason for death.

9. FIR was lodged by father of Meena on 30th September, 2022 and police started the investigation. Case was registered against both the accused under Sec. 103 (1), Sec. 124 (1), Sec. 87 r/w Sec 3(5) INS, 2022. Prateek was also alleged to have committed the crime under Sec. 78, INS, 2022. On 1 November, 2022, Police arrested accused no.1, Prateek and accused No. 2, Naveen from the farm house of Prateek and also seized his swift car of red color (registered on the name of Mr. Prateek) in which various bottles of chemicals were found.

There were finger prints of various people including accused No. 2, Naveen on the bottles of chemical (Hydrochloric Acid, Nitric Acid, Sulfuric Acid) with some glass beakers and flask. No fingerprints of Prateek were detected on the chemical containers. The Forensic Science Laboratory report stated that due to contamination and insufficient sample quantity, the acid residue collected from the victim's clothes could not be conclusively matched with the seized chemical samples. Police seized the mobile phone of accused no. 2 Naveen and the mobile of accused No. 1 Prateek was missing. According to mobile data, the contact dial history was deleted. There was a message sent by Prateek to Naveen, delivered at 3:35 PM, on 27th September 2022 "Come fast, otherwise we will miss it". During investigation, certain

WhatsApp messages between Meena and Prateek were recovered which reflected cordial and polite exchanges, though no message explicitly conveyed romantic acceptance. The alleged knife used by Meena was not recovered. Blood stains at the scene were not preserved as they had mixed with soil due to crowd movement.

10. In Medical Examination, various sharp scratches were found on the wrist of Naveen, and scars of injury were also found on his left knee. During interrogation with police, Naveen told the police that he met with an accident few days ago and these injuries were result of that accident only. According to police report, the bike of Naveen with broken headlight was found in his house. Prosecution Witness no. 1. Jeeva, the younger sister of Meena, narrated the whole instance of the acid attack, which Meena had told her before her death. Prosecution Witness no. 2, Mr. Satish told the past instance in which Prateek offered him to get married with his daughter and how he followed her even after her denial. According to him, Prateek has harmed his daughter as revenge for rejecting his offer and his insult in public gathering.

11. Prosecution Witness no. 3, Mr. Pratap, the tea stall owner, located near the house of Naveen, told the police during investigation about the conversation between Prateek and Naveen which he had heard on 8th September, 2022 about a girl with whom Prateek wanted to get married. According to him, both the friends were regular visitors of his stall. On 8th September, 2022, they visited the stall and spent longer time than usual as Prateek was very upset. They had a conversation for 40 to 50 minutes. Mr. Pratap has heard their conversation with few intervals as he was busy in his usual job of attending customers. He heard the conversation in which Naveen had suggested Prateek to meet the girl at a place which was free from surveillance by her family, as she might be comfortable there to express her true feelings for him.

If she got convinced, he was to take her to the temple to get married without informing her parents. If the girl had resisted, then they could convince her by threatening her organically or inorganically. Prateek, who was initially not sure about this plan of threatening and force, he had given consent to the plan with the condition that they would not cause any harm to the girl. But Mr. Pratap was not sure about the girl's name in the conversation and he had not heard any specific plan involving acid attack. As per the testimony of Prosecution Witness no. 4, Mr. Dhayal, the security guard of public park, he had seen swift car of red color near the gate of park on same day in the afternoon but he was not sure about presence of any of the

accused in the park on the day of acid attack on victim as he was dizzy on the same day due to vomiting and unwell health.

12. According to the Police report, no knife or weapon was recovered from public park or from the bag belonged to the victim. As per the statement of Prosecution Witness No. 5, Mr. Joy, who heard the screams of the victim in Public Park and called the Ambulance, when he reached near the victim, she was lying on the ground and screaming with pain. There were some blood spots near the victim. But police were unable to collect those blood samples as those spots got merged with soil and dust due to footsteps of number of persons near the victim. According to him, the incident happened anywhere between 3:30 to 4:00 PM on 27th September, 2022. In Police report, as per the statement of Mr. Rahul, Junior Lab. Assistant in Modern Health Care Laboratory, on 27th September, 2022 after lunch, Mr. Naveen went to collect the blood samples of some clients but did not return. In the evening on the same day, Mr. Rahul received call from Naveen who informed him of his failure to return as he had met with a minor accident and fallen from bike. He also instructed him to close the lab on scheduled time.

13. The Call Detail Records produced by the defense show that both accused persons' mobile phones were connected to a cell tower located near City Pulse Mall between 3:20 PM and 6:10 PM on the date of incident. CCTV footage from Gold Cinema at City Pulse Mall shows two individuals resembling the accused entering at approximately 3:18 PM; however, facial identification is unclear due to low resolution. The accused produced two movie tickets for the 3:30–6:30 PM show.

14. The prosecution did not produce CCTV footage from Central Public Park, stating that cameras were non-functional on that day. After investigation, both the accused were put to trial before the Sessions Court, where they both pleaded not guilty and claimed trial. Defense Witness no. 1 Prateek and Defense Witness no. 2 Naveen, denied their presence in Central Public Park on the day of acid attack on victim as they went for a movie show on 27th September, 2022, from 3:30 to 6:30 in Gold Cinema at City Pulse Mall which is 3 KM away from Central Public Park. They have presented two movie tickets for the same show to police during the investigation and presented in court as Exhibit 1.

15. After considering the facts and evidences, the Sessions Court has granted acquittal to both the accused no. 1 and accused no.2 from all the charges of the case on the basis of benefit of doubt. Aggrieved by the judgment of Sessions Court, the Appeal was filed by the State in the High Court. High Court considered the matter and by reversing the judgment of Sessions Court, High Court convicted the accused no. 1, Prateek and accused no. 2, Naveen under Section 105 of INS, 2022 and awarded life imprisonment to both the accused of the case. Both the accused were also convicted under section 124(1) of INS, 2022 and sentenced with imprisonment of ten years and a fine of 5 lakh rupees to each convict. Both the accused were also found guilty under section 87 of INS, 2022 and imprisonment of 7 years was imposed on both the convicts. Accused no. 1, Prateek was also sentenced to imprisonment of 2 years under section 78 of INS, 2022.

Aggrieved by the judgment of High Court, both the convicts filed a joint Appeal before the Supreme Court. Anguished by the death of his daughter, the father of victim wanted the beasts to be hanged for delivery of justice to her daughter. According to him, the death of his daughter was due to an inhuman action and the accused must be punished with death penalty by considering the death of the victim as Murder. While the Appeal filed by the (accused) appellants was already pending in the Supreme Court, he filed a Special Leave Petition in the Apex Court for seeking death penalty to the accused of the case. Taking into account, the increased number of acid attack cases in the country and death of the victims of acid attacks, the Apex Court decided to consider the matter and merged the Special Leave Petition with the Appeal. Now the matter is pending before the Supreme Court and the questions before the Supreme Court are-;

ISSUES

- 1. Whether the issued raised in Special Leave Petition by the Petitioner is considerable?**
- 2. Whether accused-appellant no. 1 is guilty under section 78 INS, 2022?**
- 3. Whether both the appellants are proved guilty beyond reasonable doubt under Sec. 103 (1), Sec. 124 (1), Sec. 87 r/w Sec 3(5) INS, 2022?**
- 4. Whether the dying declaration of victim is admissible in this case?**
- 5. Whether the amount of compensation decided by High Court is justified?**

- B.** Enforcement of three new criminal laws in Indicland on 1 March, 2022 are presumed to be same as new criminal laws enforced in our Country from 1" July, 2024.


